Introduction

Grace is the focal point of man's relationship with God. It is the expression of God's great mercy and love toward humanity. Grace allows God's justice to be satisfied while providing pardon to the sinner.

I. The meaning or explanation of grace

Ephesians 2:4-9 (NKJV) But God, who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, 5 even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), 6 and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, 7 that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. 8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of

yourselves; it is the gift of God, 9 not of works, lest anyone should boast.

A. Grace defined

Greek: charis $(\chi \alpha \rho \iota \sigma)$ - State of being favored or in favor; Divine mercy or forgiveness; Divine assistance given to man for his regeneration or sanctification; State of being pleasing to God because of responsiveness to grace.

<u>2 Timothy 2:1 (NKJV)</u> You therefore, my son, **be strong in** the **grace** that is in Christ Jesus.


- A. Grace that saves
