# The One Who Does Not Condemn

#### Scripture:

John 3:16-21, Note 17

*John 3:17 NKJV* "For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved.

#### Introduction

Jesus came into the world on an errand of mercy. He came to save men from themselves. He did not come to condemn and increase a person's burden. Rather He came to liberate them from the bondages, habits and lifestyles which weigh them down.

## I. The rule of the religious -- condemn and criticize

Mark 7:5 NKJV Then the Pharisees and scribes asked Him, "Why do Your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashed hands?"

- A. The religious expose the offenses
- B. The religious condemn the offender
- C. The religious criticize the Lord

### II. The role of the Redeemer -- justify and release

**John 3:16-21 NIV** For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. {17} For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. {18} Whoever believes in him is not condemned but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because he has not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. {19} This is the verdict. Light has come into the world, but men loved darkness because their deeds were evil. {20} Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that his deeds will be exposed. {21} But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what he has done has been done through God.

John 8:10-11 NIV Jesus straightened up and asked her, "Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?" {11} "No one, sir," she said. "Then neither do I condemn you," Jesus declared. "Go now and leave your life of sin."

- A. He came to love
- B. He came to lift
- C. He came to liberate

### III. The right of the repentant -- liberty and forgiveness

**Matthew 11:28-30 NKJV** "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. {29} "Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. {30} "For My yoke is easy and My burden is light."

<u>**1**</u> John 1:9 NKJV</u> If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

A. Confession, full forgiveness and forgotten offenses

<u>Hebrews 10:17 NKJV</u> then He adds, "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more."

- B. Release from the weight of condemnation
- C. Acceptance from our heavenly Father
