Seeing the Invisible by Faith

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 NIV

Hebrews 11:27 NIV Colossians 4:17

<u>2 Corinthians 4:16-18 NIV</u> Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. 17 For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all 18 So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal.

<u>Hebrews 11:27 NIV</u> By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the kings anger, he persevered because he saw him who is invisible.

<u>Colossians 4:17 NIV</u> Tell Archippus: "See to it that you complete the work you received from the Lord

Introduction

Moses was raised in Pharoah's palace. In his early life he was "mighty in word and deed (Acts 7:22). It was easy for him to view himself as a national leader. But after forty years as a simple shepherd, he could no longer see those leadership qualities in himself. They no longer lived in his heart. It took seeing the Invisible One to rekindle in him the willingness to fulfill his destiny.

I. When circumstances dim our faith vision

<u>2 Corinthians 2:11 (NKJV)</u> lest Satan should take advantage of us; for we are not ignorant of his devices.

2 Corinthians 4:1 (NKJV) Therefore, since we have this ministry, as we have received mercy, we do not lose heart.16 Therefore we do not lose heart. Even though our outward man is perishing, yet the inward man is being renewed day by day.

- A Having your vision ripped away by conditions outside your control
- B. Placed in circumstances alien to your plan
- C. Enduring weeks, months, even years of discouragement and disillusionment
- D. Losing hope in your vision / His promise

II. Allowing God to restore our faith vision by showing us the Invisible One

Exodus 3:5-6 (NKJV) Then He said, "Do not draw near this place. Take your sandals off your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground." 6 Moreover He said, "I am the God of your father; the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob." And Moses hid his face, for he was afraid to look upon God.

<u>1 Samuel 3:1, 7 (NKJV)</u> Then the boy Samuel ministered to the LORD before Eli. And the word of the LORD was rare in those days; there was no widespread revelation. 7 (Now Samuel did not yet know the LORD, nor was the word of the LORD yet revealed to him.)

- A. Samuel had not yet seen his vision
- B. Moses vision had died
- C. To both God revealed his purpose

III. Fulfilling our destiny by seeing the Invisible One

Exodus 3:10 (NKJV) "Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt."

Philippians 3:7-8 (NKJV) But what things were gain to me, these I have counted loss for Christ. 8 Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ

<u>Colossians 4:17 NIV</u> Tell Archippus: "See to it that you complete the work you received from the Lord.

- A. Receiving a renewed vision
- Accepting a purpose beyond what you can now conceive
- C. Acting upon the word of the Lord
