Scripture: Judges 16:20

Judges 16:20 KJV ²⁰And she said, The Philistines be upon thee, Samson. And he awoke out of his sleep, and said, I will go out as at other times before, and shake myself. And he wist not that the LORD was departed from him.

<u>NIV</u> Then she called, "Samson, the Philistines are upon you!" He awoke from his sleep and thought, "I'll go out as before and shake myself free." But he did not know that the LORD had left him.

II. Experience that became common and routine

<u>Judges 16:20c NIV</u> But he did not know that the LORD had left him.

- A. Operation of spiritual gifts began to fade
 - <u>1 Thessalonians 5:19-21 NIV</u> ¹⁹Do not put out the Spirit's fire; ²⁰do not treat prophecies with contempt. ²¹Test everything. **Hold on to the good**.
- B. Seminars replace praying and seeking God's direction
- C. Slick professionalism becomes the criteria for success rather than the presence and power

- of the Holy Spirit
- D. Imitating successful methods

III. The remedy

2 Chronicles 7:14 KJV ¹⁴If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.

- A. Humble ourselves before God and pray
- B. Seek God

<u>Jeremiah 29:13 KJV</u> And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart.

- C. Repent of our presumption and failure to seek God for direction
- D. Then God will hear from heaven
