Paul's Last Minute Instructions To The Thessalonians

Scripture: 1 Thessalonians 5:11-22

Introduction

As Paul draws this first epistle to the Thessalonians to a conclusion, he begins to give some very quick instructions. These were not instructions to be passed over, but important instructions born out of Paul's concern for the well being of this church.

I. Rejoice evermore

<u>*Luke* 10:20b</u> ...but rather rejoice, because your names are written in heaven.

- A. You have been redeemed
- B. You have everlasting life

II. Pray without ceasing

<u>**1** Timothy 2:8</u> I will therefore that men pray everywhere, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.

- A. Prayer communicates with God
- B. Prayer moves God on our behalf

III. In everything give thanks

Ephesians 5:20 Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

- A. Give thanks in everything
- B. Give thanks for everything

IV. Quench not the Spirit

<u>2 Corinthians 3:17</u> Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.

- A. Quench means to damp, hinder, thwart
- B. Spirit is our source of liberty
- C. We are not to dampen, to hinder, to thwart the Holy Spirit

V. Despise not prophesyings

<u>**1** Corinthians</u> <u>14:29</u> Let the prophets speak two or three, let the other judge:

- A. Have a proper attitude toward the vocal ministry of the Holy Spirit
- B. Let the Lord's messengers speak

VI. Prove all things

<u>**1**</u> Thessalonians 5:13</u> And we beseech you, brethren, to know them that labour among you, and are over you in the Lord, and admonish you.

- A. Put things to the test
- B. Hold onto the good

VII. Abstain from all appearance of evil

<u>2 Corinthians 6:17</u> Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you.

- A. We are to have a proper attitude toward evil
- B. We are to act properly toward evil
